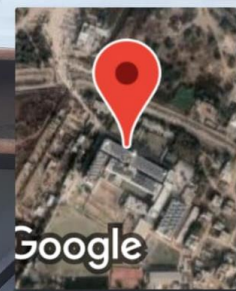
**On the occasion of Civil Services Day different activities were conducted by the department in which History students actively participated in that event**

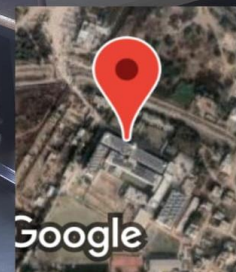
