As part of an outreach and social sensitization initiative under the Department of Commerce, 46 students from B.Com 1st Semester (Section A & D) of DPG Degree College, Gurugram, accompanied by Assistant Professors Ms. Somya Angel Rao and Mr. Amit Sharma, visited Captain Chandan Lal Special Middle School for the Blind on Tuesday, 26th August 2025.

The purpose of the visit was to engage with the visually impaired students, understand their learning environment, extend support through donations, and develop empathy and community responsibility among the commerce students

### About the Institution Visited

Captain Chandan Lal Special Middle School for the Blind, established in 1994 and managed by the All-India Confederation of the Blind (AICB), is a co-educational, residential institution catering to visually impaired children from pre-school to Class 8. The school provides education, vocational training, and emotional support to over 100 visually impaired students.

The institution is well-equipped with Braille books, tactile learning aids, a resource center, and accessible infrastructure to help students become self-reliant and confident in society.

### Activities Conducted During the Visit

- Students and faculty were warmly welcomed by the school staff and administration.
- A guided tour of the campus was organized, highlighting the classrooms, Braille library, tactile museum, and residential facilities.
- DPG students interacted with the visually impaired children through storytelling, musical performances, and games.
- A brief cultural program was organized by the school students showcasing their singing and recitation talents.

- Teachers from both institutions discussed inclusive education, accessibility in learning, and future possibilities for collaborative support.

## **Contributions Made**

As part of the outreach initiative, the visiting group made donations both in kind and in cash, including:

- **Essential daily-use items** such as notebooks, pens, hygiene kits, snacks, and tactile learning materials.
- **Monetary donation**, collectively contributed by the students and faculty, handed over to the school administration to support student welfare and educational resources.


## **Learning Outcomes**
